Information Booklet

As you know, the Government has taking the decision that **all school children** are to **return to school**, on Monday 7th September.

Symptoms of Coronavirus	 If you suspect your child or someone in your family has symptoms of Coronavirus, DO NOT bring your child to school. You and your family must book a test and report your results to school, as soon as possible, so we can take necessary action, if needed. If positive for coronavirus, the person with a positive test isolates for 10 days and your family must isolate for 14 days. In School – Safety Routines & Organisation

Social Distancing	In school we will be maintaining social distancing the best we possibly can .	Classrooms have organised with desks facing the front. Children will be seated in pairs.		
2 metres [6 feet]	The children will have expectations explained , so they understand the importance of this rule. Hopefully, as you are out in the community for daily exercise or essential journeys, you can also demonstrate this and remind your child.	One way systems have been created to aid social distancing when moving around school. Markings on the floor or playground, are laid to show 1m or 2m distance and the one-way direction. Posters are displayed around school, as reminders.		
Class Bubbles	Class year groups have been organised into 'bubbles' , to ensure the least amount of contact possible, with other children. They will spend lesson time, playtime and lunch play with the year group bubble.	Staff lead the same bubbles, unless there is absence. Children stay in the same bubble group. Bubble groups stay in the same classroom. Allocated toilet stays the same.		
Hand washing	There are strict routines in place for all children. Handwashing will take place: At home before leaving – on arrival to school – before play + snack – after play – before lunch – after lunch – before leaving for home – back at home. And obviously, if visiting the toilet.	Poster are displayed at every water point, to show the routine: 20 seconds – soap and water See poster for details on how. Toilets	Each bubble has been allocated their own toilet, in their area. This toilet is unisex in Y3 and Y4 - for use by boys and girls. In Y5 and Y6 they have boys and girls toilets. School Break & Lunch

ZonesSchool has been sectioned into outdoor zones, using the field, playground and garden area.Only one bubble group will be timetabled in that zone, at any time.		 These zones will be used for playtime, lunch play, specific outdoor lessons and garden time. On week one, lunch and play zones will be the same. They will change on alternate weeks. 		
Lunch time	Lunch time will be one hour , as normal. But again, it will be staggered into 3 groups. The pupils will spend half an hour indoors , in their bubble classroom, to eat their packed lunch. After half an hour eating lunch and desk activities, the pupils will be led out, for half an hour playtime with their bubble group only .	If bringing a packed lunch from home, it is brought into class in the morning (not the hall), and stored in their class bubble area. Pupils cannot play with just any friends – please make this clear. They must stay with their bubble group.		
Playtime	Playtime are also staggered and a zone allocated , as above. Also, with bubble group only . Non-contact play will be enforced.	Same as before, playtime will be in the same zone on one week, then change to a new zone in week 2. This will ensure pupils get equal chances to have playtime on the field or playground surface.		
Play equipment Each class bubble will have their own box of play equipment, which stays with that bubble. Pupils wash hands before playtime, have snack and then select play equipment. After play, pupils wash hands and equipment will be wiped by a member of staff.		Again, playtime will be spent with their bubble group and they must stay in their designated zone .
